

WOUNDED HERO HUNT EXPECTATIONS

The Wounded Hero Hunt (WHH) on Camp Atterbury is an event that offers Purple Heart Recipients and 100% VA rated disability veterans an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors.

What the Wounded Hero Hunt Provides

1) Lodging: The WHH will provide lodging to each wounded hero and their guest. The hunts are operated Thursday through Sunday, but we provide the option of arriving on Wednesday to make travel less stressful for the hero.



2) License: The WHH will purchase license for each wounded hero. A guest is allowed to accompany the hero during the hunt but are not allowed to harvest.



a) Turkey: One bearded turkey is authorized to be harvested during the Spring Wounded Hero Turkey Hunt.

b) Deer: Two deer are authorized to be harvested during the Fall Wounded Hero Deer Hunt. The hunt will purchase one license and the hero is responsible for the second license. Only one buck can be harvested during this hunt.

3) Meals: All meals for the heroes and guests will be provided by the WHH. The meals are coordinated and donated by businesses in the local area.



4) Hunt transportation: Each hunt is a guided hunt. Transportation down range is a coordinated effort between the hero and the guide.

5) Taxidermy services: The WHH will provide each hero a fan mount for the Spring Wounded Hero Turkey Hunt and a European mount for the Fall Wounded Hero Deer Hunt. Any other mount will be the responsibility of the hero and must be coordinated with the taxidermist.



6) Harvest processing: The WHH will process and package each animal harvested during the hunt.



What the Wounded Hero Hunt Participant Provides

1) Hunter education card: Every hero participating in the Wounded Hero Hunt will have completed a hunter education course from any state. The hunter education card will be carried on the hero during the hunt.

2) Firearms and ammunition: We recommend that each hero bring their own firearms and ammunition to the hunt. The amount of ammunition should be in enough quantity to zero the weapon and for the duration of the hunt. Special circumstances can be coordinated between the guide and hero if needed.

3) Transportation: It is the responsibility for each hero to provide their own transportation to and from Camp Atterbury for the hunt.

4) Identification: Each hero will bring a form of government issued identification. A valid driver's license, military ID card or retired military ID card are authorized forms of identification.

Frequently Asked Questions

1) What caliber of weapon can be used for the Fall Wounded Hero Deer Hunt?

a) The below link will describe and provide examples of the calibers allowed on public properties in Indiana. Camp Atterbury is considered a public property.

2) Can I bring a guest?

a) Yes. One guest can accompany you on the hunt but cannot harvest during the hunt. Lodging and meals will be provided for the guest during the hunt.
